WILL YOU TAKE TIME TO PRAY EACH DAY BEFORE THE GRAHAM TOUR?

There are so many people in our communities and across the UK who need to know about the God who loves them. This year, they'll have the opportunity to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ during the eight-city Graham Tour, which will feature a clear presentation of the Gospel from Franklin Graham. Even though these free events won't begin until May, the Lord can begin working through your prayers right now—in fact, evangelism and prayer go hand in hand. Will you take time each day to join believers across the UK in prayer for our neighbours, this nation and the Graham Tour?

Inside, you can read some suggested prayer points and accompanying Scripture passages for each day of the month before the tour begins. You can also download a background for your phone at GrahamTour.org.uk to help you remember to lift these requests up to the Lord.



DAY 1: Pray for Christ-centred revival to sweep your city, the UK and the world. (Psalm 51:10)

DAY 2: Pray for all of the evangelistic efforts in the UK in 2020. (Matthew 9:37-38)

DAY 3: Pray for the Graham Tour event in Glasgow at The SSE Hydro on 30 May. More than a third of people in this city say they don't identify with any faith whatsoever—a number that has soared since 2001. (Mark 16:15)

DAY 4: Pray for the pastors in your local congregations and for all church leaders across the UK. (Colossians 1:9-12)

DAY 5: Pray that God's Spirit would empower His church for ministry and enable us to pray for and befriend people who are far from God. (1 Timothy 2:1)

DAY 6: Pray for all logistics and the setup before and after the events in each city. Ask God to encourage and strengthen staff members and volunteers. (Hebrews 6:10)

DAY 7: Pray for the Graham Tour event in Newcastle at the Utilita Arena on 3 June. Newcastle was recently named the 'overdose capital' of the UK, and this city is full of hurting people. Will you ask God for freedom, peace and healing for these suffering men and women? (2 Corinthians 3:17)

DAY 8: Pray for Jesus to be exalted as Lord in every heart and for each believer to be ready to share Christ—who He is and what He has done. (1 Peter 3:15)

DAY 9: Pray for every believer to recognize his or her calling, to be a witness for Jesus in every place, near or far, every day. (John 13:34-35)

DAY 10: Pray for the Graham Tour event in Sheffield at the FlyDSA Arena on 6 June. The largest age group in Sheffield is 20- to 24-year-olds, a population that is rejecting religion at a faster pace than the rest of the country. Will you pray that these young men and women will discover the truth of the Gospel? (Titus 2:11)

DAY 11: Pray that, by the power of the Holy Spirit, the church will obey the instructions God gave to King Solomon—to repent, pray and seek His face. (2 Chronicles 7:14)

DAY 12: Pray for God to give our pastors—and their families—strength, encouragement and rest as they fulfill their calling. (Psalm 1:3)

DAY 13: Pray that there will be no issues with sound or audio-visual equipment at the venues during the tour. (Psalm 91:9-12)

DAY 14: Pray for the Graham Tour event in Milton Keynes at Marshall Arena on 10 June. The city's government is struggling to keep up with the number of families needing housing assistance. Will you ask God to provide for these men, women and children—physically and spiritually? (Philippians 4:19)

DAY 15: Pray for Franklin as he prepares to share God's truth and love across the UK. Will you ask the Lord to strengthen and encourage him? (Acts 1:8)

DAY 16: Pray that people will hear and believe the whole story of Jesus: His immaculate birth, His suffering on the cross, death, glorious resurrection, ascension and soon return. (Romans 8:3)

DAY 17: Pray for immigrants, refugees and tourists who come to this country, that they will hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ while they're here. Many of these men and women come from countries that were—or still are—hostile to evangelism. (Matthew 25:35)

DAY 18: Pray for the Graham Tour event in Liverpool at M&S Bank Arena on 12 June. The city is facing its worst crisis since World War II with record level of austerity. Will you pray that many of these men and women discover the hope found in Jesus Christ alone? (Mark 16:15)

DAY 19: Pray our hearts would be united in thinking of others and for the Holy Spirit to enable us to obey God's calling with a joyful heart. (Psalm 119:1-3)

DAY 20: Pray for all the staff in the UK, for the musicians who will perform and for all those participating in this evangelistic outreach. (John 7:38)

DAY 21: Pray that the impact of every Graham Tour event will be felt far beyond each city. (Matthew 28:18-20)

DAY 22: Pray for the Graham Tour event in Cardiff at ICC Wales in Newport on 14 June. Suicide is epidemic among Welsh men. Please pray that many men—and their families—hear about the peace, joy and hope Christ offers in this life and for eternity. (John 10:10)

DAY 23: Pray for men and women who used to walk with the Lord, but are now far from Him. Ask God to draw them back to Himself and transform them into bold Christian witnesses. (Matthew 18:12)

DAY 24: Pray for Jesus to be exalted as Lord in every heart and for each believer to be ready to share Christ—who He is and what He has done. (1 Peter 3:15)

DAY 25: Pray for your local elected officials and for the specific issues your community is facing. (Proverbs 21:1)

DAY 26: Pray for the Graham Tour event in Birmingham at Arena Birmingham on 17 June. Violent crime has risen in Birmingham and all over the West Midlands region. Will you pray for victims, perpetrators and for an end to this evil in Birmingham, in the West Midlands and all over the UK? (Mark 16:15)

DAY 27: Pray for the men and women who have graciously volunteered for the Graham Tour and that each position will be filled by the right person. (1 Peter 4:10)

DAY 28: Pray for children, teenagers and young people all across the UK to surrender their lives to Jesus Christ. (Matthew 19:14)

DAY 29: Pray for follow up efforts, and ask God to help every new—or renewed—believer get connected in a local church. (2 Timothy 2:2)

DAY 30: Pray for the Graham Tour event in London on 4 October. Human trafficking is a serious issue in the city. Will you pray for every man, woman and child who has been exploited and for an end to this evil in the UK and around the world? (Mark 16:15)

DAY 31: Give thanks to the Lord for all He has done and will continue to do in and through the church in the UK. (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)
