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<b>Day 1:</b> The Old Testament invites us to look into the account of lives impacted by God. Today read <b>Genesis 12:1-20</b> : What are five facts you discover about Abraham?

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<b>Day 2:</b> Today enjoy reading <b>Genesis 13-14</b> . Please pray before you read these chapters and invite God to give you eyes to see the insights He desires for you to glean:			
End your time thanking God for being a personal, powerful, and faithful God who sees you!			

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<b>Day 3:</b> Let's turn our attention to Chapters 15 & 16. Once again, ask God to guide you in seeing the insights He desires to impart to your heart. In Chapter 15, what stands out to you about God?
About Abraham?
About the events and time frames referenced in verses 12-21?
Such realities may "test" our ability to smile at the days to come. Remember <b>Hebrews 12:1-2</b> : we're to focus on God, not our circumstances. It is God, and His Word, that we must rest & rely upon. Read <b>Genesis 16</b> . What insights do you glean about Sarai?
What stands out in Chapter 16 as a "Defining Moment" for Sarai?
We also meet Hagar. What insights do these verses provide you with regarding Hagar's plight?
By this time you should be able to identify some things that have taken root in Sarai, and Hagar:  Sarai:

It is here that Defining Moments occurred for Hagar: How did she respond to God?
Take a moment to look up El Roi. What does it mean?
This realization was a powerful one for Hagar; and can be for each of us as well. How?

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<b>Day 4:</b> I hope you have gained some insights about human nature and how our natural nclinations can collide with Divinely appointed moments in which we are faced with choices to give in to: fear, impatience, lack of faith, envy, bitterness, avoidance and the inclination to take matters into our own hands (Usually doesn't work out so well!) Sarai, Abraham, and Hagar each made choices when they took matters into their own hands; choices that had significant impact. How thankful we can be with the reality of "But God."
