Week 3 Yahweh: LORD Jehovah Jireh: The LORD Will Provide

YHWH: (LORD) God's personal, covenant name – to be handled with reverence and love.

YHWH is known as a Tetragrammaton: consonants and no vowels. "Jehovah" is the same name based on the Latin equivalents of the Hebrew letters, JHVH. Jehovah is the spelling that developed from combining these consonants with the vowels of a Hebrew word for "Lord" (Adonai). The Jews who do not read YHWH as Adonai read it as Ha-Shem ("The Name"). Yahweh is a "covenant" name and is a perpetual testimony of God's faithfulness to His promises; God is ever present to help, save, bless, deliver, and redeem.

Key Scriptures:

"God said to Moses, 'I AM [YHWH/Yahweh/LORD] who I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: "I AM has sent me to you." God also said to Moses, 'Say to the Israelites, "The LORD [Yahweh], the God of your fathers—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob—has sent me to you." This is my name forever, the name you shall call me from generation to generation." Exodus 3:14-15 (NIV)

"God also said to Moses, 'I am the LORD. I appeared to Abraham, to Isaac and to Jacob as God Almighty [El Shaddai], <u>but</u> by my name the LORD [Yahweh] I did not make myself fully known to them. I also established my covenant with them to give them the land of Canaan, where they resided as foreigners. Moreover, <u>I have heard</u> the groaning of the Israelites, whom the Egyptians are enslaving, and <u>I have remembered</u> my covenant." Exodus 6:2-5 (NIV)

"So the LORD spoke to Moses face to face [heart to heart], as a man speaks to his friend..." Exodus 33:11 (NKJV)

Day 5: Today's Growth Opportunity is a bit more personal in some ways. I would like you to consider one of two options: 1. Specifically contact someone God draws your thoughts to; let them know that they are on your heart, in your thoughts, and that you are praying *specifically* for them and for God's redemptive touch in their lives. (This can be done by a note, a phone call, or a text). 2. Now take some time to personally intercede for them, and for anyone else that God puts upon your heart as you "cease striving and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10). Prayer list/names God stirs:

As you pray for them, praise the name of Yahweh; the One who indeed does, and will, work all things together for good.

We also noted in our session together an additional attribute of God found in His name **Jireh: "I Will Provide;" thus Yahweh (Jehovah) Jireh: "The LORD Will Provide."** God promises He will provide for what our authentic needs are: healing of our hearts, comfort, courage, strength to persevere, renewed hope, faith to embrace Him more fully. Take a moment to write out Isaiah 55:8-11 (continue on by reading verse 12):

What promises stand out to you from this passage of Isaiah 55?

Always remember: in fact, God is true to His Word, His character is flawless, and His heart is faithful and true.

As well, glance once again at Proverbs 3:5-6. Growing strong in a faith that truly trusts is an ongoing process. Like Abraham, will you take a step of faith in placing your trust in God to provide for your every need?
