**Jehovah Mekoddishkem* (M'Kaddesh): The LORD Who Sanctifies You

*May also be written as "Yahweh" M'kaddesh (or Mekoddishkem): (LORD) Using God's personal, covenant name. Jehovah is often respectfully used instead of God's personal, covenant name: YHWH.

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Week 5: Growth Opportunity

Day 1: This week we are focusing upon two more names of God—Jehovah Tsidkenu: The LORD our righteousness, and Jehovah Mekoddishkem (or M’kaddesh): The LORD who sanctifies. These names emphasize the precious reality of God’s redemptive work in our lives and His promise to sanctify us. “Sanctification” is the process of being made holy, which results in a changed lifestyle for those who believe, trust, and obey. It follows redemption (Colossians 1:13-14). As He works in our lives, He calls us His own: holy, set apart, His witnesses. Look up and write out Leviticus 20:8.

Conclude your time today by letting this verse frame your prayer: *“Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, because he has come to his people and **redeemed** them.”* Luke 1:68 (NIV)

Day 2: To be “redeemed” means that a price was paid to secure the release of someone or something special. What does 1 Peter 1:17-19 reveal about the price paid for our lives? _____

Psalm 78:35 (NIV) states: *“They remembered that God was their Rock, that God Most High was their **Redeemer**.”* This is a place to pause, ponder, and prayerfully embrace truth. May praise to God fill your heart and your mouth!

Jehovah M’kaddesh makes you stand out as He sanctifies you (Exodus 31:13). Kadash: to be holy, sanctified, separate.

Day 3: Precious; we are redeemed by God, and pronounced righteous through Jehovah Tsidkenu: *The LORD our righteousness!* God, Jehovah Mekoddishkem, *The LORD who sanctifies*, brings about a “new thing” in our lives each day. Begin your time with thanksgiving for this reality; write out Lamentations 3:22-23. _____

Don't rush past these treasured, tremendous truths! God loves you with a steadfast love that never ceases, and He greets you each day with new mercies! **Great is His faithfulness!** Isn't that incredible? What does it mean to you to be redeemed and loved with God's everlasting love? _____
