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As we seek Jesus through the declaration of His names, turn to John 10 where the third and fourth "I Am" statements Jesus made about Himself can be found. Each of Jesus' seven "I Am" statements identify an aspect of Himself as well as the spiritual needs of mankind.

Week 3: Growth Opportunity

Day 1: This week we will look at two more of the **I Am** statements found in John's Gospel. Begin your time today by reading John 10:1-21. This is a *wonderful* passage of Scripture. Take time to sit and savor God's truths found in this passage. Write out things that are noteworthy: blessings, promises, cautions—whatever the Holy Spirit draws your attention to:

The third I Am statement is found in John 10:9: "I Am ______."

What are the promises that accompany this I Am statement? ______

God declares His love for you through this I Am statement. What is He saying to you?

Conclude your time in a prayer of praise for His unfathomable, undeniable, unending... love for YOU!

Day 2: Turn again to John 10:7-10. What does Jesus offer you? _____

Acts 4:12 states: "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved." In John 3:16, what made this gift of salvation a reality? ______ Indeed, God loves us so much. This truth must be embraced in faith as fact in order to encounter Jesus.

In John 10:10, Jesus stresses that a predator exists; who is he and how is he described?

What is this predator's threefold pursuit?

Satan hates God, and since he cannot dethrone God, he targets those who are God's: Believers. The Greek word for "thief" used in this passage means "one who steals." What do you think this thief desires to steal from believers; to invade, seize, or carry away?

James 4:7 and 8 instruct believers with a twofold stance when the thief is in pursuit: ______

What does this look like; to "resist"? _____

How do we "draw near" to God?
What is essential to hold onto? (see Philippians 2:16)
How can this occur?
Now look at Philippians 4:13. What is the promise?

As we conclude today with a focus on the Shepherd, and the thief, Ephesians 6:10-18 instructs believers on how to "dress" spiritually as one in God's flock. Envision what this would look like as you put each item on at the Shepherd's instruction. We are protected, victorious as we draw near to Him.

Day 3: The fourth I Am statement is sure to be a *delightful* encounter with Jesus. It's found in John 10:11:

"I Am the Read John 10:11-18. What characterizes our Good Shep	herd?
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How can God's sheep discern the Good Shepherd's voice? This is important, as the thief is sly in implementing "Deadly D" schemes to: Distract and Discourage, as well as to stir feelings of Defeat, and Doubt in God.

Day 4: Today is a day for a spiritual walk with the Shepherd. Turn to Psalm 23. Will you walk with your Shepherd through this passage, inviting Him to speak into your life as your Good Shepherd, as well as thanking Him for His loving care for you, His sheep, as declared in this passage?
