He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the LORD Almighty will accomplish this."

## **Week 6: Growth Opportunity**

lesus often referred to Himself as the <b>Son of Man</b> ; this refers back to Daniel 7:13-14 (NIV): "In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all nations and peoples of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed." Jesus: fully man, and fully God.

John 14:16-18, and John 16:13, powerful takeaways:
We are never left on our own. Jesus, the Wonderful Counselor, speaks into our lives as we embrace God's Word. In turn He guides and instructs us, helps and heals us, works in and through us. As you close your time in prayer, quiet yourself that you might discern those things God is whispering to your heart:
Day 4: Isaiah 9:6 prophesies that the Messiah will be "Mighty God." "Mighty" in the original Hebrew text referenced the Messiah's great power, authority, leadership like none other. What characterized Jesus' "might" while on earth, according to Luke 4:36?
In 1 John 4:2-4, we discover a powerful truth regarding Jesus, our Mighty God, and all who invite Jesus into
their heart:
1 John 5:4-5
Our Mighty God dwells within us! Wow! We are called to <i>actively</i> "clothe" ourselves in His Truth; Ephesians 6:10-17. He equips His followers to be victorious and to experience His power and might as <i>active faith</i> prevails.
What does this entail, per this passage?

We have a mighty, victorious God. However, if we are haphazard, inconsistent, or double-minded regarding matters of faith and spiritual attire, we will be vulnerable in the face of Satan's schemes, weakened in our ability to stand firm. Take God at His Word, get dressed spiritually, and stand firm!

**Day 5**: Isaiah 9:6 further prophesies that the Messiah will be our "**Everlasting Father**," without end, protective and loving towards all adopted into God's family through His death and resurrection.

Lastly, Jesus is declared in this prophecy to be the **Prince of Peace**. The events of life in a fallen world can stir those "Deadly D's" of **distraction** from Truth, **discouragement**, and ultimately, **doubt in God**.
