I hope you will take this Truth to heart: God desires to speak to you, to shape you, to strengthen you, to refine you, and to use you for His Kingdom and eternal purposes. I hope that through this study you will have gleaned Biblical insights that settle in your heart and strengthen your spiritual journey, daily life, and relationship with the Lord. Before you begin this week's Growth Opportunity, I encourage you to pray, pause, and prioritize inviting God to speak to your heart. He indeed loves you so very much!

Day 1 (From Session 1): In the Potter's Hands - Surrendered

Remember from week 1: Ruth, Naomi, and Orpah. Each came to a fork in the road and had to choose what

they would 'return to' or prioritize. The physical famine in the land was a reflection of God's children's

spiritual condition. May it not be that we have a deaf ear to hearing God. As Amos 8:11 calls it, "a famine of

As you consider your relationship with God, is there anything that is hindering you from being fully surrendered to <i>Yatsar</i> , your Potter? If so, it is essential that you make an intentional choice, hopefully in which you'll draw near to Him as you tend to whatever is seeking to hinder you from being fully surrendered.
Ruth's story was a seemingly 'small' story; yet we see through her faithfulness to God that she is part of the lineage of Jesus' birth. Our seemingly small stories and steps of faith are part of the bigger story God is telling. Remember from session 1: Have a fixed focus on Him (Hebrews 12:1-2), trust Him with all your heart (Proverbs 3:5-6), and surrender to Him daily (Galatians 2:20). End today by revisiting Ephesians 2:10 – "For [I] am
Conclude your time in prayerful pause with <i>Yatsar</i> , the One who is faithfully forming and fashioning you. Personal reflections:
Day 2 (From Session 2): Shaped by the Potter
"This is the word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord: 'Go down to the potter's house, and there I will give you my message.' So I went down to the potter's house, and I saw him working at the wheel. But the pot he was shaping from the clay was marred in his hands; so the potter formed it into another pot, shaping it as seemed best to him." – Jeremiah 18:1-4, NIV
Yatsar means: to form, fashion, create, or shape something with intention and purpose; the Potter. What do you recall from this session regarding God having in His hands a pot that was marred (Hebrew – <i>Shachath</i>):
As we looked at Genesis 3 and the account of "the Fall," we saw that since the Fall, each of us are marred by sin. We are also vulnerable to 'faulty thinking' and a 'fractured faith.' What do you recall about the Fall's impact on our relationship with God?
We are inclined to doubt God—one of Satan's strategies to have individuals keep God at a distance. Have you experienced his scheme from the pit: to distance us from and cause us to doubt God, in your relationship with God?

If so, be intentional to seal up any cracks with Truth. Remember John 8:32, ",
In John 4, we were invited to see Jesus and his interactions with the woman at the well. How did Jesus respond to all that He knew about this woman—with condemnation or grace?
We know that as the Potter shapes us, He desires to remove debris: anything that compromises us as His vessels. Once again, a fork in the road occurred as this woman was confronted with her lifestyle choices and Jesus' way. As she stepped towards Him, He filled her emptiness. We all have times when we feel empty. Does this reality resonate within you at this time in your journey?
Jesus desires to fill our lives with Himself; not artificial, temporary fillers. What does John 10:10 state?
We are all marred; but in His hands, we're marvelous. Close your time today reading and reflecting upon Psalm 139 and note any personal reflections before you conclude today in a prayer of praise, as well as a prayer for <i>Yatsar</i> to heal and fill those empty spaces that are in need of His tender grip of grace.
Day 3 (From Session 3): Slippage in Our Earthenware
"Like a coating of silver dross on earthenware are fervent lips with an evil heart." – Proverbs 26:23, NIV
Slippage is any movement away from an original, or secure, place. We gleaned in this session how Adam and Eve experienced slippage in their relationship with God, and how we can as well. Proverbs 4:23 pertains to each of us:
During session 3 we explored various kinds of spiritual slippage that can occur in our earthenware due to our sin nature (Romans 3:23, Romans 5:8). Some of these were: my will vs. Thy will; blame shifting; justification of our actions/defensiveness; fear of man; lip service; flattery/praise of mankind; love of money; and masquerading as a servant of righteousness. We all experience slippage. Which of these resonated the most with you?
What does Enhesians 4:27 state?

Assuming God has opened your spiritual eyes to this area of slippage, have you considered steps you desire to take to eliminate these inroads into your vessel?
Take some time to review the verses we identified as part of the remedy for slippage, but begin with 1 John 1:9
Others were: Matthew 6:33
Psalm 37:31
and Psalm 119:11
Consider implementing an action step in response to each of these four passages. Consider talking with someone, and praying it through, if you are stirred by the Holy Spirit to take such a step. It can indeed strengthen us when we have someone come along side of us. Close today with Isaiah 1:18!

Day 4 (From Session 4): Strengthened by the Refiner's Fire "Shall what is formed say to the one who formed it, 'You did not make me'? Can the pot say to the potter, 'You know nothing'?" – Isaiah 29:16, NIV
In session 4 we looked at the life of one of God's servants who is described in James 5:17:
We saw in 1 Kings 17-18 how Elijah's journey with God was characterized by two things:
and then Elijah
As we wait on the Lord and listen to what He imparts to our hearts, He then promises us in Psalm 32:8 the following:
We must choose if we will obey, or not. What happened when Elijah took his eyes off of God and instead focused on circumstances?
Did this reality resonate within you?

We saw in week 4's lesson that fear, fatigue, spiritual weariness, mountaintop moments, busyness, mental and emotional exhaustion can impact us spiritually. Which of these impacts you most regularly?
Is there anything else that you have identified that tends to take its toll on your relationship with God?
What have you gleaned is a wise course of action when you are vulnerable due to one (or more) of these impacting elements?
In session 4, we explored "refining fires." What have you learned about God's appointment of refining fires?
Reread James 1:2-6. What is God's desired outcome from trials and the testing of our faith?
What was the "D" in the acrostic "Refined" that I forgot to mention in the video session?
Yes, "Delight." We're to consider trials in what light?

On that note, read Philippians 4:13 and conclude your time in prayer, especially reflecting with God on waiting, hearing, obeying, and the attitude of your heart in the reality of trials. As well, thank Him for how He promises to see us through each refining fire He permits to touch us as His vessels!

Day 5 (From Session 5): Set Apart

"Does not **the potter** have **the** right to make out of **the** same lump of clay some **pottery** for special purposes and some for common use?" – Romans 9:21, NIV

In week 5 we looked at one of God's servants, Mary. We saw that as the birth of Jesus was proclaimed to Mary, the reality of it had been foretold throughout the pages of Scripture, ie. Genesis 3:15; Micah 5:2; and Isaiah 7:14, to mention a few. As this thread is woven throughout Scripture, it stands out that God is faithful to His Word. He will bring to pass everything He has promised! Everything! Each of us are vessels that are "set apart"—set apart *from* the world and *for* God. Glance back at week 5 and note the three things that accompany the reality of being set apart for God:

Sit with this Truth for a few moments. God put His greatest treasure in the most common, and fragile vessel available: humanity. Do you remember from our session why Paul wrote 2 Corinthians 4:7 to the Corinthians?
He did not want them to lose heart; to wane in hope. Our hope comes from where?
"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth in to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." 1 Peter 1:3, NIV
Jesus is our LIVING hope! And His indwellinsg presence provides us with we need to live a godly life through our knowing Him (2 Peter 1:3-4). How does this reality impact your thoughts as you consider how you will walk out each moment that comes in each day God appoints? (Jesus within us and the power of the Holy Spirit)
Whatever your greatest challenge currently is, with Jesus within you and the Holy Spirit empowering you, you can indeed walk it out in both faith and victory. Remember, don't forget to get dressed! Our spiritual attire is essential for victory!
The Armor of God: Ephesians 6:10-17, NIV – "Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God."
Close your time today with the exhortation that is repeatedly noted in Ephesians 6:18-20 Savor these moments with <i>Yatsar</i> , your faithful, loving, strong, tender Potter! Reflections:
